

Certificate in Project Cycle Management (13 days)

Overview

This Certificate course provides comprehensive training for beginners and advanced users. It will equip you with the essential skills, tools and good practices from the field to successfully manage projects in development cooperation and humanitarian work.

All modules follow a participatory approach based on case studies, with many exercises and facilitated discussions. This allows trainers and participants to bring in and share their experiences in the group.

This certificate course comprises three independent but mutually reinforcing modules:

- 1. Needs Assessment (5 days)
- 2. Planning, Programming and Monitoring Projects (5 days)
- 3. Evaluating Projects (3 days)

Training Methodology

Emphasis is placed on "action learning" and each module features presentations, structured learning experiences, facilitated discussions, individual and group activities.

- Choose the right type of assessment & select the team
- Prepare the data collection
- Write the term of reference
- Collect information: observation and interviews techniques
- Ensure the reliability of information: bias and triangulation
- Use Participatory Rural Appraisal (PRA) tools
- Process data
- Map stakeholders
- Analyse and work on findings: the problem tree
- · Formulate recommendations and write the report

- Master the monitoring process

3. Evaluating Projects

- Understand the methodological context of evaluation
- Understanding the founding principles of evaluation
- Mastering the criteria and types of evaluation
- Making the link between the evaluation and the project planning stage (logical framework)
- Define evaluation criteria & evaluation questions
- Define the budget, identify the resources and design the work plan of the evaluation
- Define the type of evaluation: internal or/and external?
- Determine the relevant data collection methods to answer the evaluation questions
- Collect information
- Analyse and interpret the collected information
- Draft evaluation conclusions and recommendations
- · Communicate and share evaluation findings
- Adopt corrective actions; incorporate actions in programmes' documents
